Let’s practice our nuučaañuł vocabulary for these words with some fun activities!

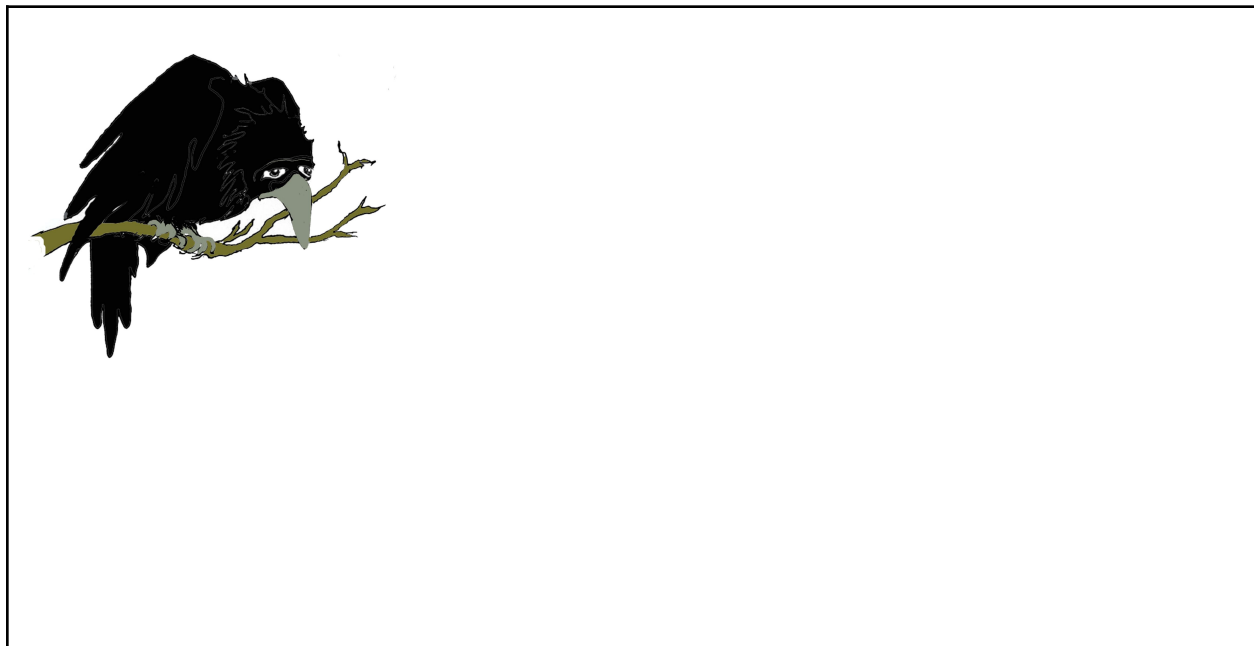
Activity #1: What Does Raven See?
