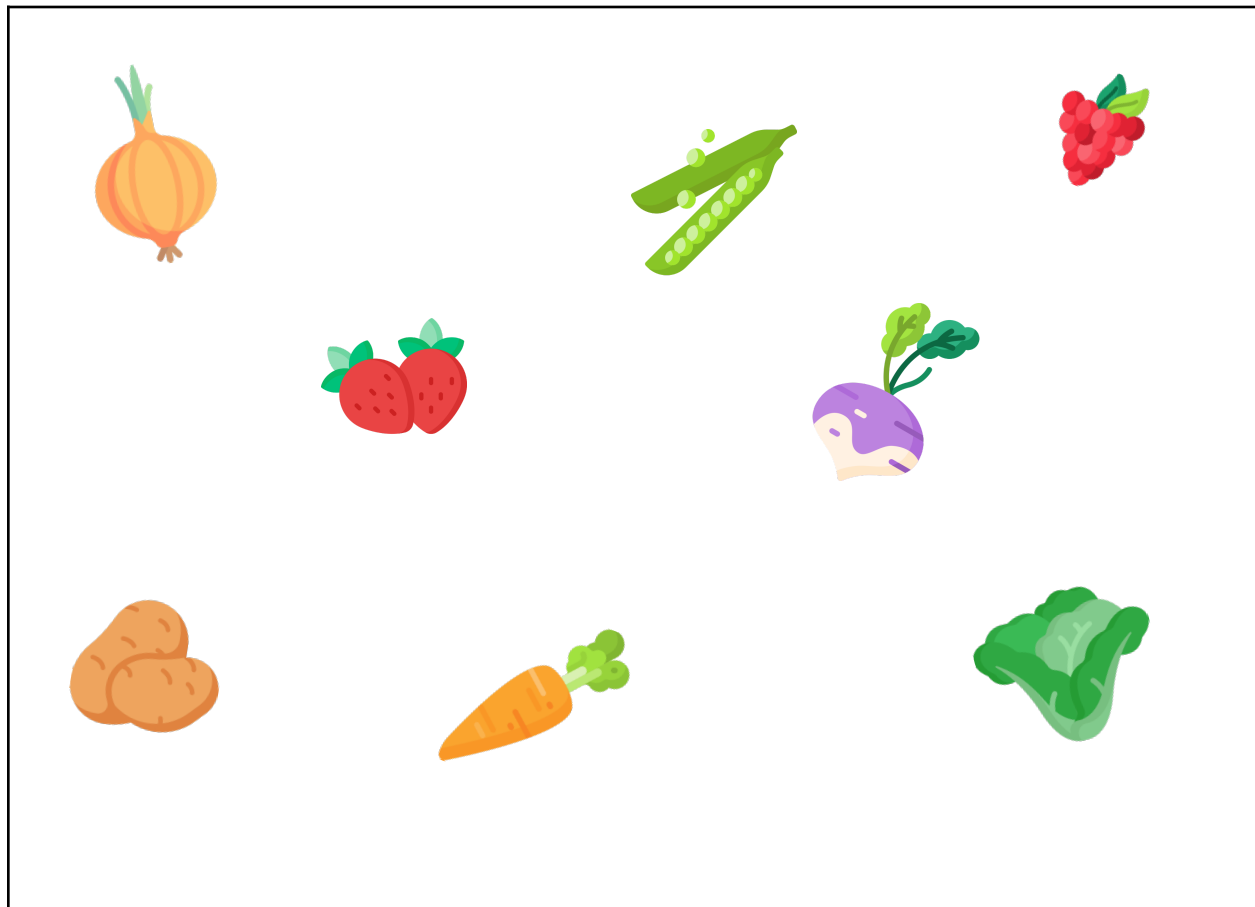
Activity #2: tuuk^uwasu^uwas Harvest
